Accepting the position of foreman at Rebel Ranch is an answer to his prayers, as it keeps him close to his family and enables him to offer his mother financial assistance, along with a home-health aide.

Kate too is surprised to run into Jess. He was her first and only beau and they dated through college. Though they were close, in reality their backgrounds were very different. Jess was the son of a physician and Kate lived most of her life in a trailer on the wrong side of Rebel.

On graduation day, Jess proposed and Kate walks away. She's a Rainbolt and his father was eager to remind her that she would never be good enough for his son.
